

## Lesson 28 Borrowing

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### I Was a Miner

I was a zinc miner in Faro, Yukon from 1973 to 1982. Working in the dark had risks. I used my lamp to find my way. I put the zinc in a truck. Most days we filled 9 trucks, but one day we filled 14.

#### Fast Facts • Borrowing

You may need to borrow when you are subtracting numbers with two or more digits. If a digit in the number you are subtracting is bigger than a digit in the same column you are subtracting from, you need to borrow from the next column.

Example:

	tens		ones
7	8	1	2
-4	8		6
3	6		6

In the ones column 6 is bigger than 2. You will need to borrow 1 ten from the tens column and put it in the ones column.

$$12 - 6 = 6$$

Finish by subtracting the tens column. Since 1 ten has been taken from the tens column the 8 is now a 7.

$$7 - 4 = 3$$

$$\text{The answer to } 82 - 46 = 36$$
