Start with the Story

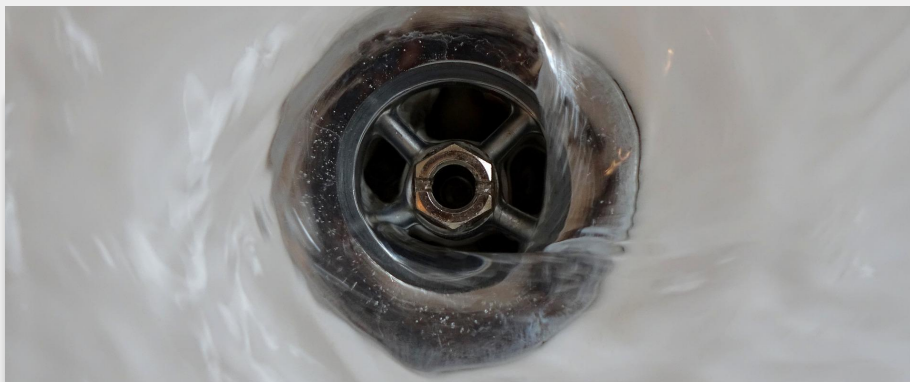
Read the story together.

Ask your child what they think is happening based on the picture.

Emphasize the sound of /g/ whenever possible.

Be sure to practise the /g/ sound action - move your hand in a downward spiral like water gurgling down a drain, and say /g/ /g/ /g/ /g/.

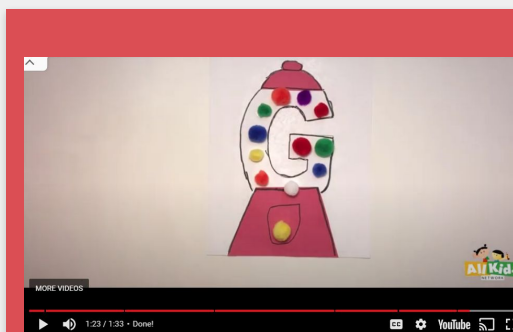

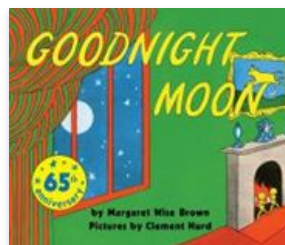

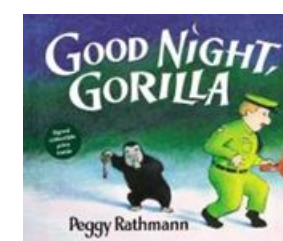
